PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Hitting Our Stride –

I think that describes ASSET pretty well these days because we are really starting to see some payoff from some initiatives that ASSET has been developing and working towards over the past few years.

For example, on June 7th we sponsored a very successful (both financially and educationally) CEU course for the therapists in the Jacksonville Florida area. We are also nearing an agreement with our first corporate sponsor. Success this year in these areas is allowing us to price the registration fee for this year's annual conference \$200 below "cost" and is also allowing us to make up for some shortfall in recurring expenses that dues does not cover. The board believes we have established a template for ongoing success in both these areas. The board's goal is to have a steady stream of annual income from one or both of these sources to keep annual conference registration low and decrease dependence on dues revenue (if dues is our only source of income we will need to raise dues to equal expenses).

In the communications committee's report you will also see we have upgraded our website in several ways this year, completed separate brochures for both potential members and corporate sponsors, and are working towards increasing search engine visibility. Meeting these goals has already paid dividends now as well as the years to come.

Kennedy's Inaugural Address in 1961: "Ask not what ASSET can do for you, but what you can do for ASSET". COMMUNICATION COMMITTEE REPORT



EDUCATION COMMITTEE REPORT

Continuing Education Course—Bryce Gaunt, Reg Wilcox, and Chuck Thigpen along with Dr. Sam Young & Dr. Rahul Deshmuk presented “Evidence Based Rehabilitation of Rotator Cuff Repairs” on June 7th at the University of North Florida in Jacksonville. There were over 100 attendees and ASSET made a profit of over \$6500.

Post Surgical Guidelines:

Instability guidelines—The instability guideline is currently a 30 page draft of a manuscript being reviewed by Bryce, Mike Shaffer, and Chuck. Upon completion of the current revision it will be forwarded to Lori Michener for final revisions before submission to JOSPT before the fall meeting.

Rotator cuff guidelines—The rotator cuff guidelines are being developed by Reg Wilcox III, Brian Leggin, and Chuck Thigpen. A rough draft is completed and a proposed outline of the guideline will be presented and discussed at the Fall meeting.

TREASURER REPORT

As of May 31, 2008 ASSET had \$26,263.44 in it's bank account.

Income for the first five months of the year was \$19,427.11 with membership dues and continuing education course registration fees comprising the majority of this. Income from membership dues is less than projected so far this year. Membership is down with 9 resignations and 6 new member additions.

Expenses are at \$7,703.38 with a \$5,000.00 down payment for the Santa Barbara conference being the bulk of this. The majority of expenses from the Cont Ed course have yet to be paid out.

The Rotator Cuff Course posted a profit of \$6,554.00 which exceeded budget projections. An interesting note for future consideration is that we did this very cheaply due to great planning and organization from Chuck and the committee and it still cost us almost \$9,000.00 to put on a one day course.

The Annual Conference in September will be the main event for the second half of the year and will mainly be an expense as usual.
